TRENTON RECONNECTED: PERRY STREET AND THE D&R CANAL TOWPATH

As one of the most high-volume roadways in Trenton, NJ, Perry Street is unsafe for both pedestrians and cyclists. EJBeings conducted a Complete Streets and Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) report to evaluate Perry Street, as well as an undeveloped portion of the D&R Canal Towpath. The report aimed to determine how this corridor could be improved to better serve this community's residents. Streets, as well as access to nature and public spaces, are vital aspects of our everyday lives. Our proposal for this corridor prioritizes the people of Trenton above all else. This street design will improve pedestrian and cyclist safety, while connecting residents to schools, parks, and community centers in their local neighborhood.
